<p>Admission Requirements Applicants for admission to the Post Baccalaureate Certificate in Information Technology Management program must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hold a baccalaureate degree in computer science, information systems, or a related area, or • Hold a baccalaureate degree and have significant professional-level experience with information technologies. <p>If the potential applicant does not have a degree, but believes his or her education and experience is equivalent to an undergraduate degree, then it is the responsibility of the applicant to put forward this position in writing as part of the application process.</p> <p>Applications for program admissions will be considered only if the applicant has full and unrestricted access to the World Wide Web.</p> <p>Currency of academic credentials more than five years old will be an issue and it is the responsibility of the applicants to provide evidence that they have worked in IT field in past five years to keep their knowledge and skills current.</p>	<p>Admission Requirements Applicants for admission to the Post Baccalaureate Certificate in Information Technology Management program must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hold a baccalaureate degree in computer science, information systems, or a related area, or • Hold a baccalaureate degree and have significant professional-level experience with information technologies, or • Hold the CIPS ISP designation or equivalent (i.e. Canadian IT Professional (CITP) or Certified Computing Professional (CCP) designation). <p>If the potential applicant does not have a degree, but believes his or her education and experience is equivalent to an undergraduate degree, then it is the responsibility of the applicant to put forward this position in writing as part of the application process.</p> <p>Applications for program admissions will be considered only if the applicant has full and unrestricted access to the World Wide Web.</p> <p>Currency of academic credentials more than five years old will be an issue and it is the responsibility of the applicants to provide evidence that they have worked in IT field in past five years to keep their knowledge and skills current.</p>	<p>To align the admission requirement of the Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Information Technology Management (PBC-ITM) with the admission requirements of the Master of Science in Information Systems (MSc-IS).</p> <p>To offer the opportunity for students holding the CIPS-ISP designation to apply also to the Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Information Technology Management. Especially, that the PBC-ITM can be laddered to the MSc-IS.</p>

A minimum of 21 credits in Sociology concentration electives: SOCI All SOCI courses</p>	<p>Adding SOCI 335 and SOCI 337 to the required courses will align the Concentration regulations with those of the Major and Minor. It will also provide the necessary courses to successfully meet the program objectives. Since the required credits have been increased by 6 credits, the minimum elective credits need to be reduced by 6 credits, from 27 credits to 21 credits.</p>
